






Harnessing the power of Niagara (supercomputer)

New demand for data processing in the rapidly approaching "zettabyte era" is creating a corresponding requirement for compute capacity. How are data centre operators responding?

In the academic community, where the supercomputer rules, the goal is to maximize resource delivery while minimizing extraneous software features. SciNet's Scott Northrup describes the 'no frills' approach to data centre operation adopted in the build of Canada's largest research computer, Niagara, a bare metal system with no GUIs, but massive parallel processing power. "It's a stripped-down race car — there are no windows on it," he explained.
